Bromley Tories selling to the highest bidder?



Bromley Council has announced a general call for developers interested in the Churchill Theatre site on Bromley High Street, despite previously reassuring residents that the site would be sold or given to the current leaseholders Trafalgar Theatres, preserving its use as a theatre.

It now appears that no agreement has yet been made with the Trafalgar Group, with the Council citing value for money concerns over the proposed sale.

Bromley Liberal Democrats are concerned the Conservative-run council are simply looking to sell the site to the highest bidder, rather than keep a theatre on the site. Our petition, launched last year, attracted over 5,500

signatories from local residents, highlighting just how important the theatre is to our community.

We will continue to campaign to keep our Churchill Theatre on this site. Any redevelopment of the site will take many months - in the meantime let's keep on supporting the theatre and buy tickets to its wonderful productions.

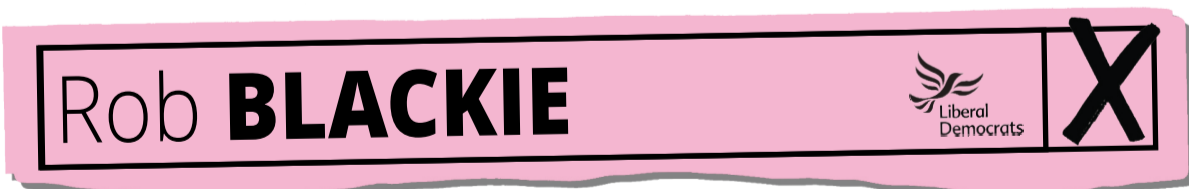

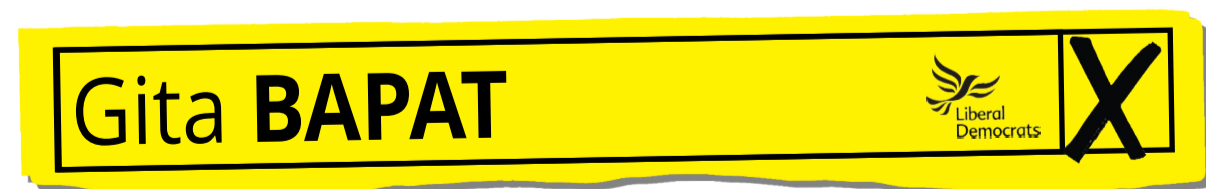
